LEOPOLD KOHR, a native of Oberndorf, near Salzburg, graduated from the Universities of Vienna and Innsbruck; he left Austria during the dictatorship of Dolfuss and pursued his studies further at the University of Paris and the London School of Economics. He had a varied career—he was a journalist covering the Spanish Civil War, and worked subsequently in a Canadian Gold Mine before re-entering academic life as a teacher in American universities, and later as Professor of Economics and Public Administration at the University of Puerto Rico. This year he has joined the University Ćollege of Wales, Aberystwyth, as Tutor in Political Science.
